The Winchell name is immediately recognizable in racing circles. Ron Winchell oversees his family's Winchell Thoroughbreds, a high-end racing and breeding operation located on his 320-acre Corinthia Farm near Lexington, Ky., that currently owns more than 120 horses, including racing and breeding stock.

The Winchells own leading 3-year-old Epicenter, the Kentucky Derby and Preakness runner-up who avenged those narrow defeats in Saratoga's prestigious Travers Stakes. Epicenter was born and raised outside of Bowling Green, Ky., on Westward Farms owned by Mike Harris and his family.

The Winchells were co-owners of 2017 Horse of the Year and Breeders' Cup Classic winner Gun Runner, now a stallion at co-owner Three Chimneys Farm. The Winchells bred and raced Untapable, the 2014 Kentucky Oaks and Longines Breeders' Cup Distaff winner and champion 3-year-old filly, and campaigned Gainesway Farm's world-renowned sire Tapit, in whom they still owns 50-percent interest.

Winchell also operates the Jackpot Joanie's chain of gaming-bar outlets, three locations of Winchell's Pub & Grill as well as The Gin Mill and Golden West Restaurant and Casino throughout Greater Las Vegas and elsewhere in Nevada. He also is involved in construction and real-estate development.

Ron Winchell is the son of the late Verne Winchell, founder of Winchell's Donuts empire, later the CEO and chairman of the Denny's restaurant chain and a noted horse owner and breeder who died in 2002 at age 87. Jackpot Joanie's are named for Winchell's mom, Joan, his partner in Winchell Thoroughbreds and Verne's widow. Ron Winchell's passion for racing is a tribute to Verne Winchell's commitment to and history in Kentucky horse racing and breeding.

Through the years, Winchell family runners also have included champions Tight Spot and

Mira Femme and the accomplished runners 2012 Breeders' Cup Dirt Mile winner Tapizar, 2005 Kentucky Oaks winner Summerly, Tapiture, Pyro, Zanjero, Donut King, Olympio, Sea Cadet, Fleet Renee, Valiant Nature and more recently Finite, 2021 Metropolitan Mile winner Silver State and Preakness runner-up Midnight Bourbon, a leading 3-year-old of 2021. Winchell Thoroughbreds also was a breeder of Grade 1 winner Paddy O'Prado.

"Some of my fondest early memories are of visiting racetracks with my father, and thoroughbred racing has been a passion of mine ever since," Winchell said when the intent to purchase Kentucky Downs was announced in November 2018. "As such, I am personally thrilled to be carrying our family name into this exciting opportunity to take the reins of Kentucky Downs, one of American racing's great success stories of the past decade. This represents the first step in our plan to further advance racing and HHR (historical horse racing) in the Commonwealth."

"Kentucky Downs is one of horse racing's brightest success stories of this era," he said upon the closing of the sale in March 2019. "We are committed to increasing that trajectory and are looking at options for expanding and improving the overall guest experience. We very much look forward to working with local and state officials, the Kentucky Horse Racing Commission and our sister tracks in Kentucky for the betterment of the commonwealth's signature industry. As I told the racing commission, I have spent my entire life around horse racing, and that passion will be a backdrop for every decision we make."

Marc Falcone brings significant financial and gaming experience to Kentucky Downs, having been a top casino executive and leading financial analyst before teaming with Winchell to form Kentucky Racing Acquisition LLC.

Falcone served as executive vice president, chief financial officer and treasurer of Red Rock Resorts Inc. and Station Casinos from 2011 to 2017. His investment business background includes Goldman Sachs & Co., where he focused on restructuring transactions in the hospitality and gaming sectors; Magnetar Capital, and Deutsche Bank Securities Inc., where as managing director he was recognized as one of the gaming, lodging and leisure industry's top analysts.

"The previous owners were visionaries who saw the potential of Historical Horse Racing as an industry game-changer," Falcone said upon the closing of the sale in March 2019. "They demonstrated not only the financial promise of Kentucky Downs but showed how it could be used to strengthen the entire Kentucky racing circuit and turn Kentucky Downs into a major economic engine for the region. Our focus will be to continue Kentucky Downs' financial success and commitment to the Kentucky racing industry. We've been working hard, and the future looks very promising."

"Kentucky Downs has had a great history here, going back to when it was originally called Dueling Grounds," Falcone told the gathering at the November 2019 ground-breaking for an ambitious, multi-phased expansion and renovation project, the first phase of which was completed in

August 2020. “As Ron and I conceptualized what the next phase of expansion would be, it was really taking the next step into creating that broader entertainment destination. We’re going to increase food and beverage offerings, increase entertainment offerings, more live music - just a better experience. It’s going to be much more exciting, much more fun, much more higher energy — and taking into account the great history that the track has always had in this community.

“This sits in an ideal location, 30 minutes outside of Nashville, an exploding population getting close to two million people. We said, ‘Hey, this is 300 acres of an opportunity to do much more than racing and historical horse racing. There are opportunities for much broader things with the real estate we have here long term. We looked at this as a 10- year project to encompass how to maximize and create a destination here in Franklin, Ky.”

Ted Nicholson has been a behind-the-scenes difference-maker throughout his career in horse racing. In his first four years at the helm overseeing the Kentucky Downs operation, betting on Historical Horse Racing at the facility increased from \$349 million in 2015 to \$1.12 billion (the vast majority of which is returned to players) in 2019, an increase of more than 300 percent.

Betting on the track’s live race meet went from \$16.88 million for five days in 2015 to \$74,088,532 for six days in 2021, up 450 percent.

A native of Arlington Heights, Ill., and graduate of the University of Arizona’s Racetrack Industry Program, Nicholson was assistant general manager at Arlington Park when the new facility opened in 1989 after the track burned in 1985. He was vice president of operations at Suffolk Downs from 1991-1998 during the Boston track’s renaissance that saw Cigar twice win the Massachusetts Handicap.

Nicholson returned to Arlington Park under its Churchill Downs Inc. ownership as vice president of operations for the suburban Chicago track before being sent to New Orleans as vice president and general manager of the Fair Grounds Race Course & Slots and its 10 OTB facilities in the wake of Hurricane Katrina. After overseeing that massive restoration process, Nicholson reorganized Calder Race Course in 2008-2009 before leaving horse racing to be the first general manager of Louisville’s KFC Yum! Center, opening that state-of-the-art sports and concert facility to great reviews.

History in the Making

Sept. 22, 1826 — The most famous duel to be held on the future site of Kentucky Downs came after Tennessee Congressman Sam Houston unsuccessfully opposed the appointment of a Nashville publisher to the role of Nashville Postmaster. When Houston returned home from Washington, he was promptly challenged to a pistol duel at 15 paces by Gen. William White, a professional duelist standing in for the postmaster, who felt his reputation had been besmirched. Houston gravely wounded White, who eventually recovered. Houston became governor of Tennessee the next year and went on to lead the Texas revolution, becoming president of the Republic of Texas and then senator and governor after Texas became a state.

April 22, 1990 — Lexington horseman Bradley “Mike” Shannon’s Simpson County Steeplechase Association holds a one-date meet with both steeplechase and flat racing, headed by the \$750,000 International Hurdle, the world’s richest jump race. The 1 5/16-mile turf course had been laid down on gently rolling farmland on the Tennessee border and a colonial-style clubhouse built for a total of about \$8 million. The track is named Dueling Grounds in a shout-out to the property’s early 19th Century heritage as a place for gentlemen to resolve differences with a duel, which was outlawed in Tennessee but legal in Kentucky. A total of \$270,627 is wagered on that inaugural four-race card. After a couple of years, Dueling Grounds ditches its initial steeplechase focus for flat racing and adds more dates. The track also becomes mired in financial, legal and political problems.

Oct. 11, 1992 — Dueling Grounds moves to the fall for its third one-date meet. Subsequent race meets, ranging from four to nine days, are held in September.

Feb. 1, 1995 — Shannon sells controlling interest in Dueling Grounds for \$4.3 million to Earl and Rita Sinks’ newly formed Heirloom Music Corp. based in Nashville.

Aug. 30, 1996 — The Kentucky racing commission shuts down the track after Dueling Grounds fails to set aside the money to pay the \$2 million in purses for the 1996 meet.

1996 and 1997 — No racing is held.

July 17, 1997 — Dueling Grounds sells for \$11 million in federal bankruptcy court in Louisville to a partnership headed by Turfway Park and Churchill Downs, with other investors including Brad Kelley, the self-made billionaire entrepreneur who grew up in Simpson County; Lexington attorney and developer Brent Rice, and a private investment concern that includes Outback Steakhouse founder and CEO Chris Sullivan. The name is changed to Kentucky Downs to emphasize being part of the Kentucky racing circuit and to shed the unfavorable association to the track’s former self. Turfway Park manages the track.

Sept. 23, 2001 — The \$300,000 Kentucky Turf Handicap (now the Calumet Farm Kentucky Turf Cup) at 1 1/2 miles becomes the first graded stakes to be run in track history, having been afforded Grade 3 status by the American Graded Stakes Committee.

Oct. 19, 2004 — Brad Kelley becomes Kentucky Downs’ majority owner, in part by exchanging \$3.2 million in Churchill Downs stock for most of the Louisville track’s stake in Kentucky Downs.

March 22, 2007 — The pending sale of 85-percent interest in Kentucky Downs to a partnership headed by investment banker Ray Reid and former Lone Star Park president Corey Johnsen is announced with Brad Kelley, Churchill Downs and Turfway staying in for 5 percent each. The sale closes that summer before the live race meet. The new partnership ultimately buys out the previous owners’ minority shares.

July 14, 2011 — The Kentucky Horse Racing Commission approves Kentucky Downs’ request to implement Historical Horse Racing machines, which employ cutting-edge technology to marry electronic gaming with the parimutuel wagering system that is a linchpin of American racing. The track projects that purses will rise from \$150,000 a day at the meet to \$250,000 in 2012.

Sept. 2, 2011 — Kentucky Downs launches Historical Horse Racing (at the time known as Instant Racing) with 200 terminals. The average purse at the live-race meet is \$25,660.

Sept. 19, 2012 — In its first meet with purse money generated by Historical Horse Racing, Kentucky Downs closes out five days of racing paying out an average of \$417,330 a day and \$48,527 per race.

Sept. 9, 2017 — The Kentucky Downs Ladies Turf and Kentucky Downs Turf Sprint are run as Grade 3 races for the first time. A then-track-record \$8,487,323 is wagered.

Sept. 8, 2018 — Kentucky Downs breaks the \$10 million mark in handle for its 10-race card, with betting totaling \$10,039,008. The Kentucky Downs Ladies Sprint is run as a Grade 3 race for the first time, one of four graded stakes on the card.

Sept. 12, 2018 — \$7,313,857, then the third-highest in track history is bet on a Wednesday, a card postponed from Sunday after significant rain hit the region.

Sept. 13, 2018 — A total of \$7,021,553 is wagered on a Thursday, a record for a Kentucky Downs’ closing day and sending wagering on the five-date meet to \$36,421,722 — a 20-percent increase over the 2017 record of \$30,246,888. Purses total a record \$10,233,665.60, not including the \$2.9 million in purse money and Kentucky-bred supplements transferred to Ellis Park and \$500,000 apiece to Churchill Downs and Keeneland in agreements with horsemen and the Kentucky Horse Racing Commission.

Nov. 13, 2018 — Noted horseman and Las Vegas-based entrepreneur Ron Winchell and prominent gaming executive Marc Falcone announce an agreement to buy all the assets of Kentucky Downs for an undisclosed amount.

Nov. 30, 2018 — The Franklin-Simpson Stakes for 3-year-olds is awarded Grade 3 status for 2019, giving Kentucky Downs five graded stakes out of its 12 stakes that are eligible to be graded by the American Graded Stakes Committee.

Dec. 31, 2018 — Kentucky Downs concludes 2018 with total wagering of \$814,541,369 on Historical Horse Racing for the year, an increase of 26.25 percent over the record \$645,176,291 in 2017.

March 2019 — The partnership headed by Ron Winchell and Marc Falcone officially take possession of Kentucky Downs.

Sept. 7, 2019 — Michael Hui’s Zulu Alpha captures Kentucky Downs’ first \$1 million race, the Grade 3 Calumet Farm Kentucky Turf Cup, over 2018 winner Arklow. Totally Boss wins the \$700,000, Grade 3 RUNHAPPY Turf Sprint (formerly the Kentucky Downs Turf Sprint), the first Breeders’ Cup “Win and You’re In” Challenge Series race in track history. A record \$11,321,492 is wagered on the 10-race card.

Sept. 12, 2019 — The RUNHAPPY Meet at Kentucky Downs concludes its five-date meet again breaking wagering records, with betting from all sources totaling \$41,239,699, up 13.2 percent over 2018. Kentucky Downs sets a record for each of the meet's corresponding dates, including the \$7,280,542 bet on the closing card. Money paid out to horse owners totals a record \$11,520,380, for an average of \$230,407 per race. Also in 2019, another \$5 million in purses and Kentucky-bred supplements generated at Kentucky Downs is transferred to Ellis Park in agreements with horsemen and the Kentucky Horse Racing Commission.

Oct. 29, 2019 — Kentucky Downs is awarded a sixth racing date for 2020, allowing for the track to run more than five days for the first time since 2008.

Dec. 31, 2019 — Kentucky Downs finishes the year with a record total of \$1,120,153,954 wagered on Historical Horse Racing, an increase of 38 percent.

March 19, 2020 — With the COVID-19 virus pandemic, Churchill Downs postpones the Kentucky Derby until Sept. 5 in an agreement with Ellis Park. Kentucky Downs agrees to give up its scheduled opening day, Wednesday, Sept. 2, to Churchill Downs, with Kentucky Downs' new dates for 2020 becoming Sept. 7 (Labor Day), 9, 10, 12, 13 and 16.

June 10, 2020 — Kentucky Downs reopens for Historical Horse Racing and simulcasting after being closed almost three months.

Aug. 18, 2020 — Kentucky Downs announces that because of COVID-19 restrictions and outbreaks, spectators would not be permitted at the race meet, with attendance limited to horsemen and their guests.

Sept. 1, 2020 — Kentucky Downs holds a ribbon-cutting ceremony and Grand Opening of its new 30,000 square-foot expansion to celebrate the rebranding of the gaming side into The Mint Gaming Hall.

Sept. 12, 2020 — A track-record \$17,437,731 is wagered on Kentucky Downs' 11-race card, headlined by Arklow taking the \$1 million Calumet Turf Cup for the second time in three years.

Dec. 18, 2020 — Kentucky Downs receives its first and second stakes to be elevated to Grade 2 status, with the \$1 million Calumet Turf Cup and \$600,000 Franklin-Simpson for 3-year-olds elevated from their Grade 3 rating. The Tourist Mile (renamed the WinStar Mint Million for 2021) is awarded Grade 3 status for the first time, giving Kentucky Downs

Dec. 31, 2020 — Even being shuttered almost 25 percent of the year, The Mint Gaming saw \$925,811,173 wagering in 2020 on historical horse racing.

April 6, 2021 — Kentucky Downs announces it will have three \$1 million races for the first time, adding the \$1 million FanDuel Turf Sprint (G3) and \$1 million WinStar Mint Million (G3) to the \$1 million Calumet Farm (G2).

Sept. 5 — Kentucky Downs begins the six-day meet on a course which underwent its most significant renovation since it was laid down as a steeplechase course in a field in 1990, when the track was known as Dueling Grounds. Butch Lehr — who spent years as the track superintendent at Churchill Downs and is an internationally prominent consultant on racing surfaces and track maintenance — oversees the makeover project, which includes Duralock temporary rails that allow for three running lanes to ensure fresh ground every couple of race days.

Sept. 8 — Snapper Sinclair wins a division of the TVG Stakes (now the FanDuel Tapit) to become the first horse to win three stakes races at Kentucky Downs.

Sept. 11 — A track record \$20,849,967 is wagered on the 11-race card, shattering the previous mark of \$17,437,731 on the corresponding Saturday. Two-time winner Arklow runs in the \$1 million Kentucky Turf Cup (G2) for the fourth time, losing by a neck after being bottled up in traffic.

Sept. 12 — The meet concludes with \$13,899,277 wagered to bring the six-day total to \$74,088,532 — a 24-percent increase over the \$59,828,441 bet in 2020. Five of the six days at the 2021 meet top \$10 million. A record total of \$15,974,800 is paid out in purses to horsemen, up 37 percent. Joel Rosario wins four races to finish the meet with a record-shattering 17 victories, breaking the prior standard by five wins.

Dec. 29 — The Mint Bowling Green, Kentucky Downs' satellite operation for historical horse racing, opens.

Jan. 28, 2022 — The American Graded Stakes Committee of the Thoroughbred Owners and Breeders Association announces that the Big Ass Fans Dueling Grounds Derby and AGS Ladies Marathon have been elevated to Grade 3 status, giving Kentucky Downs eight graded stakes.

Aug. 2, 2022 — Kentucky Downs announces that in addition to the three existing \$1 million stakes, three other stakes purses could increase to \$1 million if a Grade 1 winner runs in the \$750,000 Ladies Turf (G3), \$600,000 Franklin-Simpson (G2) or \$600,000 The Mint Ladies Sprint (G3).

Sept. 1, 2022 — The Mint Gaming Hall Cumberland is scheduled to open in Williamsburg in Eastern Kentucky on the Tennessee border off Interstate 75. The facility is the satellite operation to Cumberland Run harness track, which is being built in Corbin, Ky., in partnership with Keeneland. Cumberland Run is scheduled to stage live racing in 2023, with the interim meet returning to Lexington's Red Mile in mid-October.

LEADING JOCKEY

Clearly jockey agent Ron Anderson made the right call in having **Joel Rosario** ride all six days of the 2021 FanDuel Meet at Kentucky Downs rather than being at Saratoga for that track's final two days. Rosario came into last year's Kentucky Downs meet with three career victories over the course. He left with 17 more — smashing the prior record of 12 wins in a meet — to earn his first riding title at the track while his mounts ran out \$2,949,307 in purse earnings. Tyler Gaffalione, the 2020 meet leader, finished second with eight wins.

“Ron is the one who is making the decision for everything, so thanks to him for all we've done,” Rosario said. “We really had a fantastic meet. I'm very blessed. Thanks to all the people who have supported us, the trainers, owners and everybody involved. We're really very excited for the meet. This was the first time we stayed here for the whole meet. We really had a lot of chances with horses, and been lucky and winning.”

Rosario started his career 0 for 19 at Kentucky Downs, including 0 for 14 in 2019 before going 3 for 14 in 2020. As it turned out, he clinched the title on the second day of the 2021 meet when he won five races for the second straight day. He capped his meet by winning four on the final card. The previous record for most wins at a meet was the 12 won by Rafael Bejarano in 2004, matched by Florent Geroux in 2015 and 2016 and by Rosario on the fourth day of the meet.

Rosario, who also earned his first Eclipse Award as outstanding jockey last year, rode 53 horses at the meet for a 32-percent strike rate. “It's beautiful here,” he said. “I like it how it is, like a country fair.”

LEADING TRAINER

Mike Maker, Kentucky Downs' all-time winningest trainer, earned his record sixth meet title at the track but shared top honors with Hall of Famer Steve Asmussen and Brendan Walsh. Each trainer won four races.

Walsh pulled into the tie with Maker and Asmussen with his final starter on closing day as Family Way captured the \$550,000 Kentucky Downs Ladies Marathon in a three-horse photo. Walsh won three races the day before — including the Grade 2 Franklin-Simpson with The Lir Jet — to pull into the hunt.

“I didn't even know, so that's nice,” Walsh said of the meet rankings. “I think that's the first time I've won any trainer's title. I love this place. The last few years have been very good to me. We always look forward to it. It's something different, and it's just growing. I was trying to tell somebody the other day, you come here seven, eight years ago and there was like two trailers here. That's not that long ago.

“It's developed so much. People you talk to, they love to come here. Big fields, the betting handle is unbelievable here. You have to have the right horse. It's great. It's something different. I think that's what makes its uniqueness. And if the horse handles it, they'll be very well-rewarded.”

Asmussen earned a share of his first Kentucky Downs training title. His four wins included Snapper Sinclair taking a division of the \$400,000 TVG Stakes for the horse's record third career stakes victory at the track.

Asmussen a month earlier surpassed the late Dale Baird for North America's all-time win lead at 9,446 when Stellar Tap won his debut at Saratoga. Stellar Tap at the time was owned by Ron Winchell, co-managing partner in Kentucky Downs.

Maker also had 10 seconds and 10 thirds while his horses ran out \$1,065,892 to lead the money standings.

LEADING OWNER

Godolphin won its first Kentucky Downs owner's title with four victories out of eight starts, including taking the \$1 million WinStar Mint Million (G3) with Pixelate and the \$500,000 Exacta Systems Dueling Grounds Oaks with Adventuring.

The meet crown was part of a huge year that saw Dubai ruler Sheikh Mohammed bin Rashid Al Maktoum's international horse-racing operation voted the Eclipse Award as both North America's outstanding owner and breeding. Godolphin finished the season with \$17.4 million in North American purse earnings, of which \$1,071,376 came at Kentucky Downs.

“It's a great atmosphere down here,” said Jimmy Bell, who was president and racing manager of Godolphin's North America operation until his retirement at the end of 2021. “Everybody really enjoys making the trip down here. This could be ‘horses for courses’ a little bit. Everybody comes in with great expectations but not all find the going to their liking. But it makes it interesting for racing: the undulations, the turns, the rising ground coming down the stretch.

“We've had four fantastic wins here from all different kinds of ways.”

All-Time Leading Trainer **Michael Maker**

Mike Maker tied with Steve Asmussen and Brendan Walsh to earn his sixth Meet Leading Trainer title, to further stamp himself as Kentucky Downs' all-time leader with 67 victories out of a record 405 starters for purse earnings of \$ 9,325,778. That includes winning the track's signature Calumet Turf Cup three times as part of his record 13 Kentucky Downs stakes victories. The title streak ended in 2019 when Maker won three races but had a record 14 seconds out of 48 starters. However, one of those wins was the \$1 million Kentucky Turf Cup with Michael Hui's Zulu Alpha. Maker, the son of the late Michigan-based trainer George Maker, trained in 1993 but didn't resume his own stable until 2003 following a long stint working for Hall of Fame trainer D. Wayne Lukas. Maker has earned a reputation for claiming horses and turning them into graded-stakes winners, especially going longer distances on turf. Pre-2019 Kentucky Downs stakes wins: 2018 KD Juvenile (Henley's Joy), 2017 Kentucky Turf Cup (Oscar Nominated), 2017 KD Turf Sprint (Hogy), 2017 Ramsey Farm (Kitten's Roar), 2017 Old Friends (Sir Dudley Digges), 2016 Kentucky Turf Cup (Da Big Hoss), 2016 More Than Ready Mile (Watchyourownbobber), 2016 Dueling Grounds Derby (Oscar Nominated), 2016 KD Ladies Marathon (Al's Gal), 2016 Dueling Grounds, 2015 Kentucky Turf Cup (Da Big Hoss), 2013 KD Turf Dash (Longhunter).

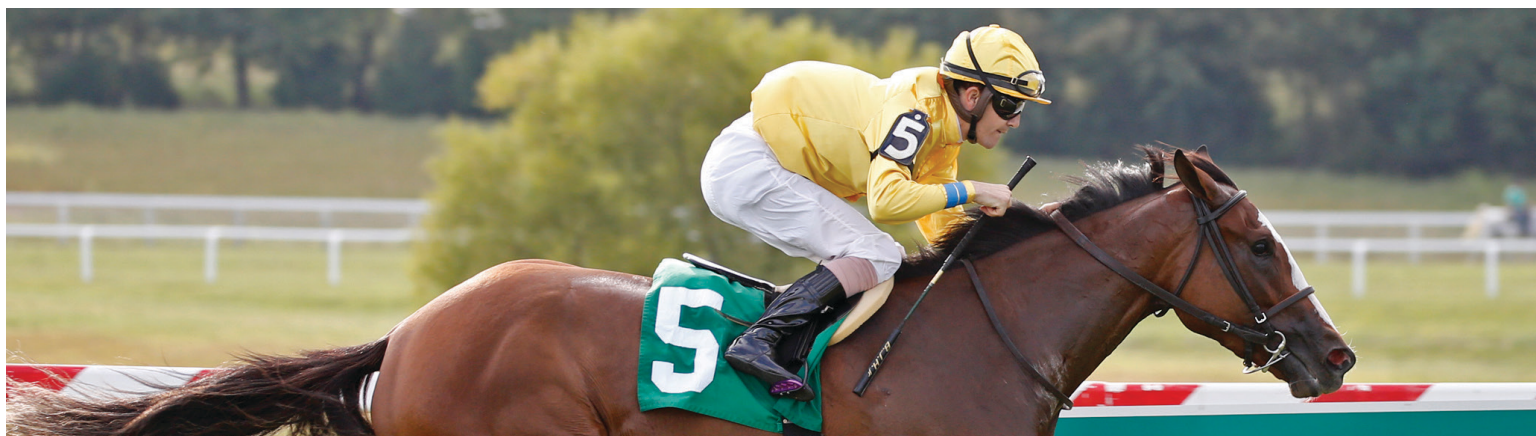

Brian Hernandez has won 55 of 335 mounts and earned \$4,343,563 in purses at Kentucky Downs since first riding at the track in 2004. A Louisville-area resident, Hernandez won the 2008 and 2012 Kentucky Downs riding titles. He has eight Kentucky Downs stakes wins: 2021 Juvenile Mile (Tiz the Bomb), 2019 Old Friends (Get Western), 2018 Franklin-Simpson (Angaston), 2017 Kentucky Downs Ladies Turf (Lull), 2016 Exacta Systems Juvenile Fillies (Lull), 2013 KD Juvenile (Boji Moon), 2012 Franklin-Simpson (Depeche Chat), 2006 Yaqthan (Tolhwin Type). Hernandez won the 2012 Breeders' Cup Classic aboard Fort Larned. He was the Eclipse Award winner as outstanding apprentice jockey in 2004, when he rode at Evangeline and Delta Downs at nights during the week and at Churchill Downs on weekends until graduating from high school in Lafayette, La., after which he began riding full time in Kentucky. Hernandez won the 2012 Breeders' Cup Classic aboard Fort Larned, who the previous year won a Kentucky Downs allowance race.

All-Time Leading Owner **Kenneth and Sarah Ramsey**

Ken and Sarah Ramsey of Nicholasville, Ky., have won nine Kentucky Downs owner titles dating to 2009, including a record nine wins at the 2013 meet. The winningest owners in the history of Kentucky racing, the Ramseys have won 47 races out of 195 starters and \$4,197,574 in purses at Kentucky Downs. The Ramseys won the Eclipse Award as North America's outstanding owner in 2004 (when they campaigned the male turf champion and future leading turf sire Kitten's Joy), 2011, 2013 and 2014 and were voted outstanding breeder in 2013. 2021 MEET RECAP

The 2021 FanDuel Meet at Kentucky Downs saw the first edition of a multi-year partnership between America's Most Unique Racemeet and one of the premier wagering platforms in North America. Kentucky Downs hosted two Breeders' Cup Challenge Series races for the first time in its history, leading a stakes schedule worth over \$6 million. Field sizes increased to an average of 10.2 starters per race, with a median purse of \$143,970 for the 2021 meet.



Opening Day - Sept. 6

Adventuring gives Rosario and Godolphin back to back Dueling Grounds Oaks wins and their first wins of the meet. Accreditt wins the Dueling Grounds Derby at large odds for Pavel Matejka and Bob Grayson Jr.



Mint Million Day - Sept. 7

Pixelate gives Joel Rosario and Godolphin their second stakes win of the meet in the G3 WinStar Mint Million. Tiz the Bomb wins Juvenile Mile in preparation for a victory in the G2 Bourbon Stakes at Keeneland and a second place finish in the G1 Breeders' Cup Juvenile Turf.



TVG Day - Sept. 8

Snapper Sinclair takes second division of the TVG Stakes to win a record third career Kentucky Downs stakes. Bonne Chance Farm's In Love (BRZ) wins division one of the TVG Stakes, and in his next start would win the G1 Keeneland Turf Mile.



Global Tote Day - Sept. 9

One Dreamer Stakes (Hendy Woods) and Global Tote Juvenile Sprint (Red Danger) highlight a card that also featured Claiming Crown Championship prep races.

Rosario breaks the track record for number of wins during a single meet, notching his 13th win of the meet with maiden Castle Leoch.



Turf Cup Day - Sept. 11

Kentucky Downs hosts two Breeders' Cup Challenge Series race for the first time in track history in the G2 Calumet Turf Cup and G3 FanDuel Turf Sprint. The pair highlighted a stakes-laden afternoon with five graded stakes on the card, marking the track's most historic raceday in the 35 year history.



Closing Day - Sept. 12

A trio of stakes for fillies and mares capped off the 2021 FanDuel Meet at Kentucky Downs with the Nelson's Green Brier Whiskey Music City Stakes, Ainsworth Stakes and Kentucky Downs Ladies Marathon.

BREEDERS' CUP

CHALLENGE SERIES



Two Kentucky Downs stakes races have been designated as Breeders' Cup Challenge Series races for the 2022 season - the G2 Kentucky Turf Cup and the G2 FanDuel Turf Sprint. Both races are now 'Win and You're In' qualifiers for the 2021 Breeders' Cup World Championships at Keeneland Racecourse in Lexington, Kentucky.

The \$1 million Kentucky Turf Cup (G2) at 1 1/2 miles is in its second year as a “Win and You’re In” qualifier for the \$4 million Longines Breeders’ Cup Turf (G1), joining the \$1 million FanDuel Turf Sprint (G2) that three years ago became an automatic qualifier for the \$1 million Breeders’ Cup Turf Sprint (G1).

Both races for 3-year-olds and up have a base purse of \$550,000 with an additional \$450,000 in Kentucky-bred purse supplements from the Kentucky Thoroughbred Development Fund.

The six-furlong FanDuel Turf Sprint will be run as a Grade 2 stakes for the first time, having been promoted from a Grade 3 by the American Graded Stakes Committee. Even with its \$550,000 base purse, the six-furlong Kentucky Downs race looms as America’s richest turf sprint outside the Breeders’ Cup.

Both races are Sept. 10 and will be broadcast by NBC Sports.

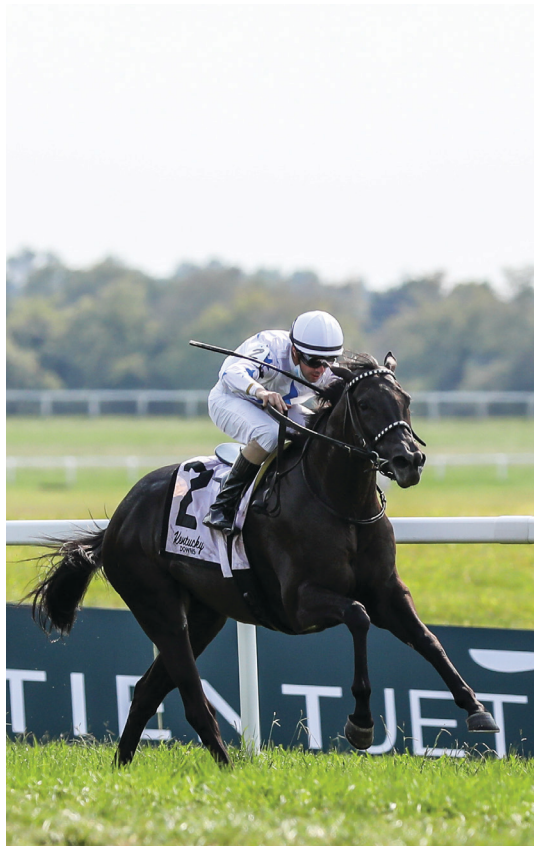

KENTUCKY DOWNS TRACK RECORDS

Kentucky Downs did not designate course records last year because a new GPS timing system that was tested in 2020 and utilized last year, along with a new rail system put in for the 2021 meet, rendered previous race-time comparisons irrelevant. The 1 5/16-mile course was placed down in a field in 1990 when Kentucky Downs opened as Dueling Grounds as a predominantly steeple-chase course. Kentucky Downs' race distances have been measured the most accurately for the 2021 meet of any time in track history. Also, the gate placement changed for some races with the new rail system.

Therefore, 2021 now is the baseline year going forward for course records.

Bonne Chance Farm's 5-year-old Imperador held off the fast-closing, hard-luck 2021 winner Arklow to win the \$1 million Calumet Turf Cup (now the G2 Kentucky Turf Cup) by a neck for his first victory in North America, completing the the 1 ½ miles with jockey Joe Talamo in 2:25.70 and paying \$19.20 to win.

Since he is not a Kentucky-bred, the Argentine-bred Imperador was running for a base purse of \$550,000.

Arklow was bidding for his third win in the race, also prevailing in 2018 and taking second in 2019. He moved up into contention entering the stretch, but ran into traffic issues.

Pixelate, campaigned by meet-leading owner Godolphin, was one of four stakes-winners as Joel Rosario won a record 17 races. The prior record for most wins by a jockey at a Kentucky Downs meet was 12. Pixelate powered past Somelikeithotbrown in the final sixteenth-mile to take the \$1 million mile race by 2 1/2 lengths.

“He deserves it because he finally got his day in the sun and got to make up for some of those times when we reached out and ran in some of the big races and he was only beaten 2-3 lengths,” said trainer Mike Stidham. “And today was his day. It was a beautiful thing. I’m so proud of the horse and what he’s accomplished.”

Tiz the Bomb, with Kentucky Downs career-leader Brian Hernandez up, out-finished favored Kiss the Sky to win the Kentucky Downs Juvenile Mile by three-quarters of a length. The Kenny McPeck-trained Tiz the Bomb backed up that performance by taking Keeneland's Grade 2 Castle & Key Bourbon Stakes, following by a second in the \$1 million Breeders' Cup Juvenile Turf.

Tiz the Bomb, whose maiden victory came at Ellis Park, returned the next spring to capture Turfway Park's Grade 3 Jeff Ruby Steaks to earn a spot in the Kentucky Derby, finishing ninth.

Tiz the Bomb is a rare horse to have raced at all five Kentucky tracks, winning at four.

2021 STAKES RECAP | HENDY WOODS

A narrow defeat in a \$120,000 stakes at Saratoga in her prior start proved profitable for Stonestreet Stables' homebred Hendy Woods. That's because she was eligible to run in the \$400,000 One Dreamer, restricted to fillies and mares that had not won a stakes that year.

The 4-year-old Hendy Woods came from off the pace under Kentucky Downs' 2020 meet leader Tyler Gaffalione to win by 4 1/4 lengths over Sweet Melania.

"Actually, I thought this was a tough race," trainer Mark Casse said. "I was surprised with the ease that she won it. She was training really well. We lost a heart-breaker with her at Saratoga."

2021 STAKES RECAP | SNAPPER SINCLAIR & IN LOVE (BRZ)

Snapper Sinclair became the first horse to win three stakes at Kentucky Downs, taking in front-running style a division of the Tapit Stakes by three-quarters of a length over Bob and Jackie. Snapper Sinclair also won the 2017 Kentucky Downs Juvenile Mile and the 2019 Tourist Mile (now the WinStar Mint Million) and was second in the 2020 Tourist Mile. “Clearly, this is a track that Snapper is very fond of and Snapper is horse we’re all fond of,” said Jeff Bloom, president of Bloom Racing, which partners with Chuck and Lori Allen on many of their horses. “He’s the coolest horse there is.” The horse was named for a jockey played by Mickey Rooney in the 1936 movie “Down the Stretch.”

The Brazilian-bred In Love won the first division of the Tapit, scooting up the rail and holding off favored Kentucky Ghost for a 2 1/4-length victory. In Love, who paid \$19.40 to win while racing in blinkers for the first time, gave French-born jockey Alex Achard his biggest purse victory in America - at least until In Love won his next start in the Grade 1 Keeneland Turf Mile.

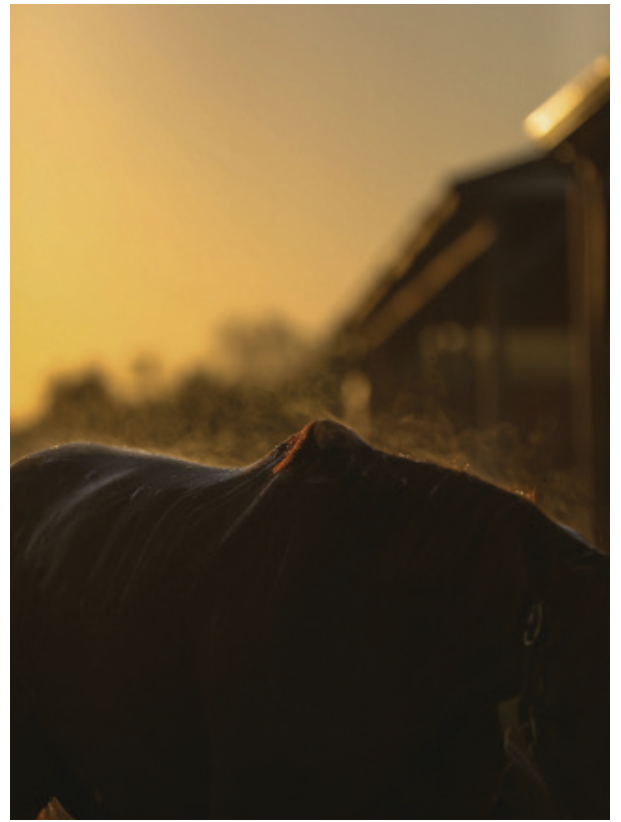

In addition to purses and Kentucky Thoroughbred Development Fund supplements paid out to owners of horses racing at Kentucky Downs, the track in an arrangement with the Kentucky HBPA transferred \$4.2 million to Ellis Park's purse account, \$1.91 million in 2020, \$5 million in 2019, \$2.9 million in 2018, \$1.65 million in 2017 and \$1.35 million in 2016. Kentucky Downs also transferred \$500,000 apiece to Churchill Downs and Keeneland in 2018. The KTDF transfers require the permission of the Kentucky Horse Racing Commission.

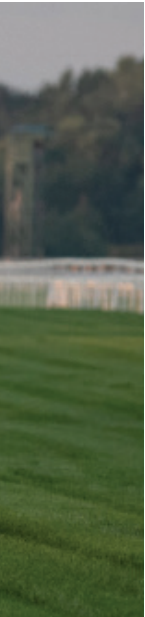
